Florist Claire May Sankey from Lily & May says: "Inspiration for the shoot began with a colour palette of apricot and mint, the perfect combination for a feminine and romantic feel. To create the bouquet, I used splashes of salmon chrysanthemums, along with salmon stocks, apricot chrysanthemum blooms and the gorgeously scented white 'O'Hara' rose. The mint accents of ranunculus, jasmine, ammi and variegated ivy were added to balance the apricot tones, interspersed with pops of 'Secret Garden' roses, white delphiniums and white anemones." Modern, pretty and with statement blooms... what more could a bride want?
